### Notes:

- 1: Terms are two-years, with a maximum of three consecutive terms. Directors must be re-elected by the CASQA membership for each additional term (e.g., subsequent terms are not automatic).
- 2: Each fall, the Executive Director conducts a call for nominations and the election.
- 3: CASQA members, who are permit holders, are eligible to vote (one vote per membership).
- 4: Terms commence January 1 and end on December 31. For example, a two-year term of 2019 and 2020 commences on January 1, 2019 and ends on December 31, 2020.
- 5: The Board consists of 11 members, with 8 spots for MS4s and 3 spots for Non-MS4s. If there are not enough candidates to fill either category, the spot can be filled at-large.
- 6: If a vacated Director position is filled with less than half of the term remaining, it does not count against term limits.
